



Child Protection Advanced Training *(Formerly called Child Protection Intermediate)*

Aim: To enable staff to be confident & effective in the decision making process in the safeguarding of children and young people and to promote a pro-active multi-disciplinary approach to working with children, young people and their families and carers.

Day 1

1. List the answers to the safeguarding quiz
2. State some of the indicators of abuse
3. Identify Child Protection/Safeguarding research
4. Assemble the framework of Child Protection which includes the most recent changes in Child Protection practice, guidance, legislation and innovations that affect practice
5. Identify Child Protection issues including developing confidence in analysing information and making professional judgements
6. Describe 10 common pitfalls in Child Protection.

Day 2

1. Describe the work of the referral team, including taking emergency action
2. State the role of Family Group Conferences, Child Protection Conferences and Core Groups
3. To summarise the impact of abuse on children, young people and their families
4. Demonstrate how to challenge other professionals where they are child protection concerns
5. Describe the involvement of the Police and Probation in Child protection
