

Child Sexual Exploitation

Course Description: This course will help professionals to understand a child's experience of exploitation, considering both victims, perpetrators and environmental factors. The main models of CSE are explored, as well as the signs and indicators of risk. The course will consider local pathways for professionals when they have concerns about a child who may be at risk of CSE, as well as how to work with children and their families. The training will equip practitioners to understand the context and their responsibility when safeguarding children.

Target Group: All staff who may be in contact with children, young people and/or parents/carers who may become aware of possible abuse, neglect or child sexual exploitation. Aimed at individuals and teams with a direct role in working with young people (individually or in a group setting)

Training Level: All levels - additional awareness training

Pre-Requisite Learning: We recommend delegates complete Level 1 Child Protection Awareness training before attending this course

Aims/Objectives:

- Understand what child sexual exploitation is and what is known about it
- Understand how young people become involved in CSE, the risks and vulnerabilities
- Explore the research relating to perpetrators of CSE, as well as environmental factors
- Consider the strategic and practical approach you/ your organisation needs to take to respond effectively to CSE
- Identify key partners within single service and multi- agency settings
- Increase knowledge of resources available to assist work with children and young people

Course Type: Classroom

Length of Course: ½ day

Valid for: One off training. Can be repeated as required
