

Emotional Abuse (Recognising and Responding to)*

Course Description: This course has been designed to promote more effective ways of working with those children at risk of emotional abuse, as well as working with emotionally abused children and families. This training will equip practitioners to understand the context and their responsibilities in relation to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children.

Target Group: In addition to level 1 training this course is aimed at professionals across all agencies working with adults who are parents, children and families. Those undertaking this course will need to have completed Child Protection Level One Training.

Training Level: Level 2/3 (suitable for update training)

Pre-Requisite Learning: We recommend delegates complete child protection training at Level 1 or 2 before attending this course

Aims/Objectives:

- Understand the definition of emotional abuse
- Have had the opportunity to discuss emotional development and the effects of emotional abuse throughout a child's development
- Identify methods of recognition / identification of emotional abuse
- Explore the causal factors in the emotional abuse of children
- Identify methods of intervention

Course Type: Classroom

Length of Course: 1 day

Valid for: Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) and any deputies within schools and early years settings, need their training to be updated every 2 years in line with Keeping Children Safe in Education Guidance 2016. For all other staff, the LSCB recommends that child protection training is refreshed every three years

Cost: £100 to organisations that do not contribute to the Swindon LSCB budget
£25 for Early Years staff
