Course Outline.

A 1 day training programme to give participants an overview on domestic violence issues.

The course explores trends of domestic violence behaviour, how to support clients, signs and symptoms to look out for, links with cultural issues, Honour Based Violence, Forced Marriage, DASH risk assessment and safety planning. The referral procedures for local and national support services.

Aims & Objectives

This course will enable participants to increase their knowledge, confidence and skills when working with victims of domestic violence and abuse and in particular those at risk of ‘Honour’ Based Violence, Forced Marriage and Female Genital Mutilation.

Competencies

- 1.1 Recognise indications of the cultural side of domestic violence and refer individuals to specialists.
- 1.2 Relate to, and interact with individuals.
- 1.3 Support individuals to access and use services and facilities.
- 1.4 Promote people’s equality, diversity and rights.
- 1.5 Contribute to the prevention and management of abusive and aggressive behaviour.
- 1.6 Contribute to the protection of individuals from abuse.
- 1.7 Relate to families, parents and carers.
- 1.8 Facilitate learning through presentations and activity
- 1.9 Facilitate group learning
- 1.10 Develop and disseminate information and advice about domestic violence and abuse and BME issues.
